### PEACE OFFICER CASUALTY CARE

**MONDAY-TUESDAY, APRIL 27-28**

### BYLAW ENFORCEMENT SAFETY TRAINING

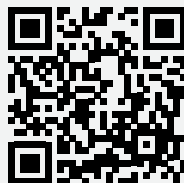
