Rock on, laugh a ton and enjoy the crowd-pleasing entertainment that is Banger Bingo!

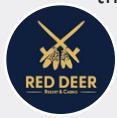


Have your dauber and air guitar skills at the ready in this game-show style event. Banger Bingo will take place after the evening's banquet.

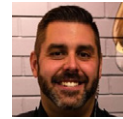
Back by popular demand!

CANINE BEHAVIOR & APPLIED AGGRESSION INVESTIGATION

WEDNESDAY-THURSDAY, MAY 1-2



Presented by Canine Aggression Specialist Nikeae Michalchuk (Maverick Dog Works), this two-day seminar is designed specifically for officers identified as first responders to aggressive animal incidents, and who are responsible for enforcing animal control legislation within the community.

Prerequisites – Attendees must be appointed Peace Officer/Bylaw Officer with Alberta Solicitor General or Municipal Animal Control Bylaw. Bring your Animal Control Bylaw, and any case files you wish to review.

* SAFER COMMUNITIES AND NEIGHBOURHOODS (SCAN)

FRIDAY, MAY 3

SCAN helps keep communities safe by dealing with problem properties that are being used for specific illegal activity such as drug trafficking, prostitution, child exploitation, and

gang-related crime. Members of the Alberta Sheriff's SCAN unit will present on how it operates, how to contact them, what they can provide to law



enforcement, and how they may be able to assist in bylaw investigations in dealing with problem residences or properties where criminal activity is occurring.
